

## NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT House Bill 779

#### Representative Brockman

moves to amend the bill on page 1, line 5, through page 2, line 4, by deleting those lines and substituting the following:

### "PART I. EXPANSION OF GROWTH EXCEPTION FOR MATERIAL REVISIONS OF CHARTERS

**SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 115C-218.7(b) reads as rewritten:

- "(b) Enrollment growth of greater than twenty percent (20%) shall be considered a material revision of the charter for any charter school identified as low-performing. The State Board may approve such additional enrollment growth of greater than twenty percent (20%) only if it finds all of the following:
  - (1) The actual enrollment of the charter school is within ten percent (10%) of its maximum authorized enrollment.
  - (2) The charter school has commitments for ninety percent (90%) of the requested maximum growth.
  - (3) The charter school is not currently identified as low-performing.
  - (4) The charter school meets generally accepted standards of fiscal management.
  - (5) The charter school is, at the time of the request for the enrollment increase, substantially in compliance with State law, federal law, the charter school's own bylaws, and the provisions set forth in its charter granted by the State Board."

**SECTION 1.(b)** G.S. 115C-217.7 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

- "(b1) Enrollment growth of greater than thirty percent (30%) shall be considered a material revision of the charter for any charter school that is not identified as low-performing. The State Board may approve such additional enrollment growth of greater than thirty percent (30%) only if it finds all of the following:
  - (1) The actual enrollment of the charter school is within ten percent (10%) of its maximum authorized enrollment.
  - (2) The charter school has commitments for ninety percent (90%) of the requested maximum growth.
  - (3) The charter school meets generally accepted standards of fiscal management.
  - The charter school is, at the time of the request for the enrollment increase, substantially in compliance with State law, federal law, the charter school's
