



NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT House Bill 998*

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Representative Boswell

moves to amend the bill on page 1, line 15, by rewriting the line to read:

"IMPROVE HEALTH OUTCOMES, AND LOWER THE COST OF CARE; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION MAY STUDY THE IMPACT OF CERTIFICATE OF NEED ON THE DELIVERY OF HEALTH CARE IN RURAL AREAS OF THE STATE.";

And to amend the bill in page 3, lines 27-28 by rewriting the lines to read:

"PART IV. STUDY THE IMPACT OF CERTIFICATE OF NEED ON RURAL AREAS

SECTION 6(a). The Legislative Research Commission may study the impact of Certificate of Need (CON) laws on the access to and delivery of health care to residents living in rural areas of North Carolina. In conducting the study, the Commission may consider the following:

- (1) The impact on rural or underserved communities of the denial of a CON to construct or expand existing health care facilities.
- (2) Recent CON determinations made by the Department of Health and Human Services and the particular bases for the determinations.
- (3) Whether past CON determinations have adversely affected rural or underserved areas with respect to health care access by community residents.
- (4) What modifications can be made to the legal requirements governing CON determination to mitigate the hardships to residents and health care facilities resulting from CON application denials or limitations.
- (5) The impact of exempting diagnostic centers, ambulatory surgical facilities, gastrointestinal endoscopy rooms, and psychiatric hospitals from CON laws and the impact that could have on health care access for residents living in rural areas.

SECTION 6(b). The Legislative Research Commission may report its findings, including any legislative recommendations, to the 2019 Regular Session of the 2019 General Assembly upon its convening."
