## 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE COMPANY POLICE THE AUTHORITY TO ACTIVATE THEIR 3 BLUE LIGHT IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS; TO DIRECT TRAFFIC ON ALL PUBLIC 4 ROADS ADJACENT TO THE FACILITY WHERE THEY ARE EMPLOYED; TO ENTER INTO MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS WITH LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES; 5 6 AND TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES 7 UPON REQUEST REGARDLESS OF WHETHER A MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT IS IN 8 PLACE. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 74E-6 reads as rewritten: 11 "§ 74E-6. Oaths, powers, and authority of company police officers. 12 Requirements. – An individual who is commissioned as a company police officer must (a) take the oath of office required of a law enforcement officer before the individual assumes the 13 duties of a company police officer. The person in each company police agency who is responsible 14 15 for the agency's company police officers must be commissioned as a company police officer. Categories. - The following three distinct classifications of company police officers are 16 (b) 17 established: 18 (1)Campus Police Officers - Only those company police officers who are 19 employed by any college or university that is a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina or any private college or university that is licensed 20 21 or exempted from licensure as prescribed by G.S. 116-15, and who are employed by a campus police agency that was licensed pursuant to this Chapter 22 23 prior to the enactment of Chapter 74G of the General Statutes. Railroad Police Officers – Those company police officers who are employed by 24 (2)25 a certified rail carrier and commissioned as company police officers under this 26 Chapter. 27 (3) Special Police Officers - All company police officers not designated as a 28 campus police officer or railroad police officer. 29 All Company Police. - Company police officers, while in the performance of their (c) 30 duties of employment, have the same powers as municipal and county police officers to make 31 arrests for both felonies and misdemeanors and to charge for infractions on any of the following: Real property owned by or in the possession and control of their employer. 32 (1)33 (2)Real property owned by or in the possession and control of a person who has 34 contracted with the employer to provide on-site company police security 35 personnel services for the property.
