OVERVIEW: Sec. 12G.4 of S.L. 2016-94, as amended by Sec. 5.7 of S.L. 2016-123, repeals North Carolina's Certificate of Public Advantage laws effective September 30, 2016, and requires any party issued a certificate of public advantage prior to September 30, 2016, to issue a final report on its activities to the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and the Attorney General by December 30, 2017. The report must include a description of the activities conducted, price and cost information, the nature and scope of activities conducted, the likely effect of those activities, a summary of activities and market impact of those activities through September 30, 2017, and any additional information requested by DHHS or the Attorney General.

This section became effective July 1, 2016.
