OVERVIEW: House Bill 262 would designate the City of Brevard, the Town of Rosman, and Transylvania County as North Carolina's official land of waterfalls.

The PCS would change the short title and update uncodified language to acknowledge two additional public lands located in Transylvania County.

CURRENT LAW: State symbols and other official adoptions of the State are found in Chapter 145 of the General Statutes. Currently, North Carolina does not have an official land of waterfalls.

BILL ANALYSIS: This act would amend Chapter 145 of the General Statutes by adding a new section to designate the City of Brevard, the Town of Rosman, and Transylvania County as North Carolina's official land of waterfalls.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective when it becomes law.
